# **Fiscal Impacts**

## **Future Fiscal Impact**

Although this bill would not require a General Fund appropriation for FY 2025-26, it is projected to require General Fund appropriations of \$24,765 in FY 2027-28 and \$38,653 in FY 2028-29 for the Department of Corrections to accommodate for a potentially higher number of offenders.

Additionally, this bill includes cash fund expenditures that increase by \$1.7 million and 9.0 FTE for FY 2025-26 and by \$1.8 million and 9.0 FTE for FY 2026-27, paid from the Wildlife Cash Fund. The Wildlife Cash Fund operates within a TABOR-exempt enterprise (the Division of Parks and Wildlife), and is projected to be able to absorb the increased expenditures without a fee or revenue increase.
