Summary Information

Overview. The bill permits the Director of Legislative Council Staff to enter into agreements to place legislative policy fellows on staff.

Summary of Legislation

The bill authorizes the Legislative Council Committee to approve agreements between the Legislative Council Staff (LCS) director and nonpartisan organizations to place nonpartisan legislative policy fellows in LCS. Any agreement approved by the committee must ensure that the director retains supervisory authority over fellows, and also specify that any work created during the fellowship remains the property of the General Assembly.

State Expenditures

Should the Legislative Council Committee choose to approve agreements with nonprofit organizations to place a policy fellow within LCS, workload will increase. A memorandum of understanding (MOU) will be created specifying the terms of the fellowship, assigning supervisory roles to existing LCS employees, and providing other details concerning the fellowship experience and required deliverables. This fiscal note assumes that any MOU entered into by LCS will not include compensation for the policy fellows to be paid by the Legislative Department. Any compensation or other financial support for policy fellows will be the exclusive responsibility of the partnering nonprofit organization. No appropriations are required.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 30, 2025, and takes effect on August 6, 2025, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
