Summary Information

Overview. The bill clarifies the use of appropriated funds to administer a grant program in the Department of Public Health and Environment.

No fiscal impact. The bill has no fiscal impact on state or local governments.

Appropriations. No appropriation is required.

Summary of Legislation

Currently, the Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) administers a grant program to help small communities with public water systems and wastewater treatment work. The bill clarifies that CDPHE may use up to 10 percent of the money appropriated for the grants to administer and manage the program.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill conforms CDPHE statutes to current practices. This results in no change to state or local government revenue or expenditures. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
