## **Summary of Legislation**

---

This bill repeals the Natural Disaster Grant Fund in the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment on July 1, 2025.

## **Assessment of No Fiscal Impact**

---

The Natural Disaster Grant Fund was created in 2014 to assist local governments with repairing or replacing wastewater and drinking water infrastructure after major floods occurring in 2013. The program and fund were authorized for use through September 1, 2015. Repealing the inactive program and fund will result in no change to state or local government revenue or expenditures. Therefore, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

## **Effective Date**

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on May 28, 2025.
