The concurrent resolution amends section 2 of article XVIII of the Colorado constitution by:

- Repealing the 5-year continuous existence requirement to obtain a charitable gaming license; and
- Authorizing a manager or operator of a charitable game to make minimum wage until 2024, when the provision repeals the prohibition on paying managers or operators.

1           *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-third  
2           General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:*

3           **SECTION 1.** At the election held on November 8, 2022, the  
4           secretary of state shall submit to the registered electors of the state the  
5           ballot title set forth in section 2 for the following amendment to the state  
6           constitution:

7           In the constitution of the state of Colorado, section 2 of article  
8           XVIII, **amend (2), (4)(c), and (6)** as follows:

9           **Section 2. Lotteries prohibited - exceptions - repeal.** (2) No  
10           game of chance pursuant to this subsection (2) and subsections (3) and (4)  
11           of this section shall be conducted by any person, firm, or organization,  
12           unless a license as provided for in this subsection (2) has been issued to  
13           the firm or organization conducting ~~such~~ games of chance. The secretary  
14           of state shall, upon application ~~therefor~~ FOR A LICENSE on such forms as  
15           shall be prescribed by the secretary of state and upon the payment of an  
16           annual fee as determined by the general assembly, issue a license for the  
17           conducting of such games of chance to any bona fide chartered branch or  
18           lodge or chapter of a national or state organization or to any bona fide  
19           religious, charitable, labor, fraternal, educational, voluntary firemen's, or  
20           veterans' organization ~~which~~ THAT operates without profit to its members

1 and which THAT IS REGISTERED WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE AND has  
2 been in existence continuously for a period of five THREE years  
3 immediately prior to the making of said ITS application for such THE  
4 license OR, ON AND AFTER JANUARY 1, 2025, FOR SUCH PERIOD AS THE  
5 GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY ESTABLISH UNDER SUBSECTION (5) OF THIS  
6 SECTION, and has had during the entire five-year period OF ITS EXISTENCE  
7 a dues-paying membership engaged in carrying out the objects of said  
8 corporation or organization, such license to expire at the end of each  
9 calendar year in which it was issued.

10 (4) Such games of chance shall be subject to the following  
11 restrictions:

12 (c) (I) No person may receive any remuneration or profit IN  
13 EXCESS OF THE APPLICABLE MINIMUM WAGE for participating in the  
14 management or operation of any such game.

15 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (4)(c) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024.

16 (6) (a) The enforcement of this section shall be under such official  
17 or department of government of the state of Colorado as the general  
18 assembly shall provide.

19 (b) THIS SECTION DOES NOT REQUIRE OR AUTHORIZE THE  
20 SECRETARY OF STATE TO RECEIVE OR REVIEW CLAIMS CONCERNING  
21 EMPLOYEE WAGES OR COMPENSATION, INCLUDING TAX CLAIMS, OR OTHER  
22 ASSOCIATED LABOR, EMPLOYMENT, OR CONTRACTUAL MATTERS.

23 **SECTION 2.** Each elector voting at the election may cast a vote  
24 either "Yes/For" or "No/Against" on the following ballot title: "Shall  
25 there be an amendment to the Colorado constitution concerning the  
26 conduct of charitable gaming activities, and, in connection therewith,  
27 allowing managers and operators to be paid and repealing the required

1 period of a charitable organization's continuous existence before  
2 obtaining a charitable gaming license?"

3 **SECTION 3.** Except as otherwise provided in section 1-40-123,  
4 Colorado Revised Statutes, if at least fifty-five percent of the electors  
5 voting on the ballot title vote "Yes/For", then the amendment will become  
6 part of the state constitution.
