# **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

## **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$168,942 General Fund to the Department of Education for FY 2019-20. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE.

#### **Points to Consider**

#### General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2019-20 based on the March 2019 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package leaves approximately \$65.2 million General Fund unallocated. Thus, the General Assembly could appropriate up to \$60.8 million General Fund to fund 2019 legislation and maintain a 7.25 percent General Fund reserve. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$168,942 for FY 2019-20, reducing the excess General Fund reserve by \$181,190.

This bill is projected to require \$680,506 General Fund for FY 2020-21 and subsequent fiscal years.
