Summary Information

Overview. The bill grants a municipality full authority over open space and natural areas that a municipality acquires outside its municipal limits.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

Current law grants cities and counties full power and authority in the management and oversight of land that it acquires outside its municipal limits for use as parks, parkways, boulevards, or roads. The bill clarifies that this authority extends to land acquired for open space and natural areas whether or not the land is open or closed to the public.

Local Government

The bill may increase workload for municipalities to enforce municipal code in open space and natural areas outside of municipal limits. It may also increase revenue if any new fines are levied for municipal violations in such properties. The fiscal note assumes any impacts will be minimal.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
