A BILL FOR AN ACT
CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE COLORADO STATE ADVISORY
COUNCIL FOR PARENT INVOLVEMENT IN EDUCATION, AND, IN
CONNECTION THEREWITH, IMPLEMENTING THE
RECOMMENDATION CONTAINED IN THE 2023 SUNSET REPORT BY
THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY AGENCIES.

Bill Summary

Sunset Process - House Education Committee. The bill implements the recommendation of the department of regulatory agencies

in its sunset review of the Colorado state advisory council for parent involvement in education (advisory council) by continuing the advisory council indefinitely.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1203, repeal
3	(15)(a)(VII); and add (25)(a)(III) as follows:
4	2-3-1203. Sunset review of advisory committees - legislative
5	declaration - definition - repeal. (15) (a) The following statutory
6	authorizations for the designated advisory committees are scheduled for
7	repeal on September 1, 2024:
8	(VII) The Colorado state advisory council for parent involvement
9	in education created in section 22-7-303;
10	(25) (a) The following statutory authorizations for the designated
11	advisory committees will repeal on September 1, 2034:
12	(III) THE COLORADO STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR PARENT
13	INVOLVEMENT IN EDUCATION CREATED IN SECTION $22-7-303$.
14	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-303, amend
15	(2)(c) and (2)(d); and add (2)(e) as follows:
16	22-7-303. Colorado state advisory council for parent
17	involvement in education - created - membership. (2) The council
18	shall consist of the following members:
19	(c) Two persons appointed by the executive director of the
20	department of higher education; and
21	(d) A representative of the department of human services
22	appointed by the executive director of said THE department OF HUMAN
23	SERVICES; AND
24	(e) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EARLY CHILDHOOD

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1	APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EARLY
2	CHILDHOOD.
3	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-304, amend
4	(1)(c), (1)(g), and (1)(h); and add (1)(i) as follows:
5	22-7-304. Council - advisory duties - technical assistance -
6	report. (1) The council shall inform, at a minimum, the early childhood
7	councils, public schools, school districts, the state charter school institute,
8	the department, the state board, the department of higher education, the
9	Colorado commission on higher education, and the governing boards for
10	the state institutions of higher education concerning best practices and
11	strategies, aligned with the national standards for family-school
12	partnerships, for increasing parent involvement in public education and
13	promoting family and school partnerships, including but not limited to
14	best practices and strategies in the following areas:
15	(c) Involving parents in response to intervention programs A
16	MULTI-TIERED SYSTEM OF SUPPORTS in public schools and school districts;
17	(g) Creating and implementing family-to-school liaison positions;
18	and
19	(h) Establishing and implementing school-based parent
20	information resource centers ADVISING EDUCATOR PREPARATION
21	PROGRAMS ABOUT BEST PRACTICES FOR INCLUDING RESEARCH-BASED
22	FAMILY ENGAGEMENT STRATEGIES IN COURSEWORK AND PROGRAM
23	REQUIREMENTS; AND
24	(i) PROVIDING FEEDBACK TO STATE AGENCIES AND OTHER
25	ORGANIZATIONS ABOUT PUBLICLY AVAILABLE TOOLS AND RESOURCES
26	THAT ASSIST FAMILIES WITH NAVIGATING THE EDUCATION SYSTEM.
7	SECTION 4 In Colorado Revised Statutes 22-7-306 amend (1)

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1	as follows:
2	22-7-306. Repeal of part. (1) This part 3 is repealed, effective
3	September 1, 2024 2034.
4	SECTION 5. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
5	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
6	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
7	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
8	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
9	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
10	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
11	November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
12	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
