	<b>Sunset bill.</b> This bill continues the Youth Restraint and Seclusion Working Group in the Department of Human Services, which is scheduled to repeal on September 1,2024. State fiscal impacts under the bill include only the continuation of the program's current workload. The program is continued through September 1, 2034.

### **Summary of Legislation**

The bill continues the Youth Restraint and Seclusion Working Group within the Department of Human Services (CDHS) until September 1, 2034. The program is scheduled to repeal on September 1, 2024.

## **Background**

The Youth Restraint and Seclusion Working Group was created in <u>House Bill 16-1328</u> and advises the Division of Youth Services in the CDHS on policies, procedures, and best practices related to restraint and seclusion and their alternatives. In addition, the working group monitors the use of confinement for administrative reasons. The full sunset report on the working group can be found here.

### **Continuing Program Impacts**

The CDHS is expected to have a minimal increase in workload to continue the working group. The department received a \$5,000 appropriation for legal services in HB 16-1328, but it is assumed that any additional, ongoing legal service will be minimal. Therefore, no appropriation is required. If this bill is enacted, current workload will continue for the program starting in FY 2024-25. If this bill is not enacted, the program will end on September 1, 2024, and state workload will decrease starting in FY 2024-25.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
