Summary Information

Overview. The bill modifies verification requirements for drivers delivering alcohol for alcohol beverage shipper licensees.

No fiscal impact. The bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, a driver delivering on behalf of an alcohol beverage shipper licensee must check the recipient's identification to ensure that they are the person who is supposed to receive the delivery, are over 21 years old, and are not visibly intoxicated. The bill removes the requirement that the driver check that the person is the intended recipient of the delivery, allowing them to deliver to any person at the address who is over 21 and not visibly intoxicated.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The alcohol beverage shipper license was created in 2024 through <u>Senate Bill 24-231</u>. Removing verification requirements on future license holders will have no impact on state revenues or expenditures; therefore, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on June 3, 2025 and took effect on August 6, 2025.
