MOTOR VEHICLE WHOLESALER AUTHORIZED INDIVIDUALS **Bill Topic:**

The bill permits only two named individuals to act as a wholesaler under a motor vehicle or powersports wholesaler license. Beginning in FY 2019-20, the bill may

minimally impact state revenue and expenditures.

Appropriation Summary:

No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status:

This fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, wholesalers must be licensed in order to sell motor vehicles and powersport vehicles to dealers. The bill clarifies that only two named individuals who are part owners of the licensed business may act as a wholesaler.

State Revenue and Expenditures

To the extent that the rate of wholesalers registrations with the Auto Industry Division in the Department of Revenue changes under the bill, state revenue and expenditures to and from the Auto Dealers License Fund may increase or decrease. This fiscal note assumes any impact is negligible.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on June 3, 2019 and takes effect August 2, 2019, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
