ALLOW COUNTY OFFICERS TO ACCEPT LOWER SALARY **Bill Topic:**

The bill allows an elected county officer to voluntarily accept less salary than

specified under current law. The bill may decrease local expenditures.

Appropriation **Summary:**

No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status:

This fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

Current law fixes the salaries for county commissioners, sheriffs, treasurers, assessors, clerks, coroners, and surveyors. These salary amounts are adjusted for inflation every two years. This bill permits an elected county officer to voluntarily receive a lesser salary. The officer may later choose to accept a higher salary, which amount may not exceed the statutory limit.

Local Government

When an elected county officer choose to accept a lower salary, county expenditures decrease for that particular personnel cost.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on July 7, 2020, and it took effect September 14, 2020.
