Summary Information

Overview. The bill removes the term "homosexuality" from the definition of sexual conduct in a section of the state criminal code.

No fiscal impact. The bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact on state or local governments.

Summary of Legislation

The bill removes the term "homosexuality" from the definition of sexual conduct in Part 5 (Sexually Explicit Materials Harmful to Children) of Article 7 (Offenses Related to Morals) of Title 18 (Criminal Code).

Comparable Crime Analysis

This bill creates a new factual basis for existing offenses regarding sexually explicit materials harmful to children, all class 2 misdemeanors, by removing the term "homosexuality." From FY 2021-22 to FY 2023-24, zero offenders have been sentenced and convicted for this existing offense.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

Because no convictions have occurred for this offense, the fiscal note assumes the bill will have no impact on state or local governments.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
