### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING ACCESS TO THE ELECTRONIC PRESCRIPTION DRUG MONITORING PROGRAM.

# **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill modifies provisions relating to licensed health professionals' access to the electronic prescription drug monitoring program as follows:

! Allows a health care provider who has authority to prescribe controlled substances, or the provider's designee, to query the program regarding a current patient, regardless

- of whether the provider is prescribing or considering prescribing a controlled substance to that patient;
- ! Specifies that a veterinarian who is authorized to prescribe controlled substances may access the program to inquire about a current patient or client if the veterinarian suspects that the client has committed drug abuse or mistreated an animal; and
- Specifies that, in addition to accessing the program when dispensing or considering dispensing a controlled substance, a pharmacist or designee of the pharmacist may access the program regarding a current patient to whom the pharmacist is dispensing or considering dispensing a prescription drug.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-42.5-404, amend

(3)(b) and (3)(d); and **add** (3)(b.5) as follows:

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4 12-42.5-404. Program operation - access - rules - definitions.

- (3) The program is available for query only to the following persons or groups of persons:
- (b) Any practitioner with the statutory authority to prescribe controlled substances, or an individual designated by the practitioner to act on his or her behalf in accordance with section 12-42.5-403 (1.5)(b), to the extent the query relates to a current patient of the practitioner; to whom the practitioner is prescribing or considering prescribing any controlled substance;
- (b.5) (I) Any veterinarian with statutory authority to prescribe controlled substances, to the extent the query relates to a current patient or to a client and if the veterinarian, in the exercise of professional judgment, has a reasonable basis to suspect the client has committed drug abuse or has mistreated an animal.

8	(d) A pharmacist, an individual designated by a pharmacist in
9	accordance with section 12-42.5-403 (1.5)(b) to act on his or her behalf,
10	or a pharmacist licensed in another state, to the extent the information
11	requested relates specifically to a current patient to whom the pharmacist
12	is dispensing or considering dispensing a controlled substance OR
13	PRESCRIPTION DRUG or A PATIENT to whom the pharmacist is CURRENTLY
14	providing clinical patient care services;
15	SECTION 2. Applicability. This act applies to queries to the
16	electronic prescription drug monitoring program occurring on or after the
17	effective date of this act.
18	<b>SECTION 3. Safety clause.</b> The general assembly hereby finds,
19	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
20	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
