#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE OF IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENTS UNDER 102 THE "COLORADO ROAD AND COMMUNITY SAFETY ACT".

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Currently, a person who is not lawfully present in the United States may obtain a driver's license or identification card if certain requirements are met. One of the requirements is that the person present a taxpayer identification card. The bill allows a social security number to also meet this requirement.

The bill also allows the license or identification card to be reissued

or renewed in accordance with the process used for other licenses and identification cards.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-2-505, amend (1) 3 introductory portion and (1)(c) as follows: 4 42-2-505. Identification documents - individuals not lawfully 5 **present.** (1) **Documents issued.** An individual who is not lawfully 6 present IN THE UNITED STATES may apply for an identification document 7 in accordance with this part 5. The department shall issue an 8 identification document to an applicant who: 9 (c) (I) Documents an individual taxpayer identification number 10 issued by the United States internal revenue service; and OR 11 (II) DOCUMENTS A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER ISSUED BY THE 12 UNITED STATES SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION, WHICH 13 DOCUMENTATION MAY INCLUDE A SOCIAL SECURITY CARD OR ANY OTHER 14 DOCUMENTATION ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT AS PROVIDED BY 15 RULE IF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT CONFIRMS THE INDIVIDUAL'S SOCIAL 16 SECURITY NUMBER, INCLUDING ELECTRONIC CONFIRMATION THROUGH THE 17 SOCIAL SECURITY ONLINE VERIFICATION SYSTEM COMMONLY KNOW AS 18 SSOLV; AND 19 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 42-2-509 as 20 follows: 21 42-2-509. Renewal - duplicate - replacement - rule. 22 (1) **Renewal.** An identification document issued under this part 5 expires 23 three years after issuance. The holder of the document must apply for 24 renewal IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 42-2-118 OR 42-2-304 to continue to hold a valid identification document. TO RENEW THE IDENTIFICATION 25

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of the required fee; passing of an eye test; passing of such other examinations as the applicant's physical limitations or driver's record indicates to be desirable; and payment of any penalty assessment, fine, cost, or forfeiture as prescribed by subsection (3) of this section. If a person renews his or her license pursuant to this subparagraph (I) SUBSECTION (1)(a)(I) by electronic means, the person shall MUST attest under penalty of perjury that he or she has had an eye examination by any AN optometrist or an ophthalmologist within three years before the date of application.

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(b) (I) Any license referred to in section 42-2-114 or 42-2-505 that, at the time of its expiration, is held by a resident of this state who is temporarily outside of this state or is prevented by disability from complying with paragraph (a) of this subsection (1) SUBSECTION (1)(a) OF THIS SECTION may be extended for a period of one year if the licensee applies to the department for an extension of the expiration date prior to BEFORE the date the license expires and pays a fee set by the department in accordance with section 42-2-114.5 (2). The department shall transfer the fee to the state treasurer, who shall credit it to the licensing services cash fund created in section 42-2-114.5 (1). This AN extension UNDER THIS SUBSECTION (1)(b)(I) becomes null and void ninety days after the licensee renews his or her residency in the state or otherwise becomes able to comply with the provisions of paragraph (a) of this subsection (1) SUBSECTION (1)(a) OF THIS SECTION. The department shall NOT grant no more than one extension under this <del>paragraph (b)</del> SUBSECTION (1)(b) unless a resident of this state is temporarily residing in a foreign country, in which case the department may grant no more than two extensions.
