### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING DENTAL SERVICES FOR PREGNANT WOMEN COVERED
102 UNDER THE CHILDREN'S BASIC HEALTH PLAN.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law requires the medical services board to include dental services for eligible children enrolled in a children's basic health plan. The bill requires the board to include dental services to all eligible enrollees, which includes children and pregnant women.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	<b>SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.</b> (1) The general assembly
3	finds and declares that nearly 900 pregnant women covered under the
4	children's basic health plan do not have coverage for dental services.
5	Approximately 25% of all pregnant women in Colorado lacked dental
6	insurance in 2016, and roughly 18% of expecting mothers reported not
7	going to the dentist because they could not afford to go.
8	(2) The general assembly further finds and declares that during
9	pregnancy, changes to a woman's diet and hormone levels increase her
10	risk for a number of oral health conditions, including dental caries,
11	gingivitis, and periodontal disease. Periodontal disease in pregnant
12	women has been linked to adverse birth outcomes, such as pre-term birth
13	and low newborn birth weights.
14	(3) Studies show that a mother's prenatal oral health has lifelong
15	effects on her child's oral health because the bacteria associated with poor
16	oral health can pass from mother to child with the potential to cause
17	dental caries in infancy and early childhood. Additionally, tooth decay
18	remains the most common chronic condition in childhood and
19	adolescence, and poor oral health among children has been linked to poor
20	performance in school and increased absences.
21	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25.5-8-107, amend
22	(1) introductory portion and (1)(a)(II) as follows:
23	25.5-8-107. Duties of the department - schedule of services -
24	premiums - copayments - subsidies - purchase of childhood
25	<b>immunizations.</b> (1) In addition to any other duties pursuant to this article
26	ARTICLE 8, the department shall have HAS the following duties:
27	(a) (II) In addition to the items specified in subparagraph (I) of

1	this paragraph (a) SUBSECTION (1)(a)(I) OF THIS SECTION and any
2	additional items approved by the medical services board, on and after
3	January 1, 2001, the medical services board shall include dental services
4	FOR ALL ENROLLED CHILDREN, AND ON AND AFTER JULY 1, 2019, FOR ALL
5	ENROLLED PREGNANT WOMEN, in the schedule of health care services.
6	upon a finding by the board that:
7	(A) An adequate number of dentists are willing to provide
8	services to eligible children; and
9	(B) The financial resources available to the program are sufficient
10	to fund such services.
11	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
12	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
13	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
