BILL TOPIC: UPDATE PAPER SPECIFICATION STANDARD FOR CRS PUBLICATION

Summary of Legislation

The bill, ***recommended by the Committee on Legal Services***, updates the paper standards required for a contractor used to publish or print the Colorado Revised Statutes (CRS). Under the bill, any contract or extension of contract, except the one in effect on January 1, 2017, must meet the alkaline reserve minimum requirements and acidity levels for uncoated paper established by the American National Standards Institute and the National Information Standards Organization.

Assessment

This bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact. The existing printing contract with LexisNexis was extended for five additional years, effective January 1, 2018. The current vendor's paper meets the standards required by the bill and it is expected that future contracts will specify the paper standard, resulting in no change in expenditures or workload for any state agency.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on May 25, 2017.
