	A BILL FOR AN ACT
101	CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE "PRIVATE OCCUPATIONAL
102	EDUCATION ACT OF 1981", AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,
103	IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN THE
104	2023 SUNSET REVIEW BY THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY
105	AGENCIES.

Bill Summary

Sunset Process - House Education Committee. The bill implements the recommendations of the department of regulatory

agencies (department), as contained in the department's 2023 sunset review and report of the "Private Occupational Education Act of 1981" by:

- Continuing the regulation of private occupational schools and their agents;
- Continuing the functions of the private occupational school division and the private occupational school board (board) for 11 years, until September 1, 2035; and
- Requiring the board to grant prior approval when a private occupational school changes ownership.
- Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
- 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, repeal
- (25)(a)(X); and **add** (36) as follows:
- 4 24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies
- 5 and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment-legislative
- 6 **declaration repeal.** (25) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both,
- 7 are scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2024:
- 8 (X) The regulation of private occupational schools and their
- 9 agents under article 64 of title 23, including the functions of the private
- 10 occupational school division created in section 23-64-105, and the private
- 11 occupational school board created in section 23-64-107;
- 12 (36) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both, are
- 13 SCHEDULED FOR REPEAL ON SEPTEMBER 1, 2035:
- 14 (I) THE REGULATION OF PRIVATE OCCUPATIONAL SCHOOLS AND
- 15 THEIR AGENTS UNDER ARTICLE 64 OF TITLE 23, INCLUDING THE FUNCTIONS
- 16 OF THE PRIVATE OCCUPATIONAL SCHOOL DIVISION CREATED IN SECTION
- 17 23-64-105, AND THE PRIVATE OCCUPATIONAL SCHOOL BOARD CREATED IN
- 18 SECTION 23-64-107.
- 19 (b) This subsection (36) is repealed, effective September 1,
- 20 2037.

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1	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 23-64-133 as
2	follows:
3	23-64-133. Repeal of article - review of functions. This article
4	64 is repealed, effective September 1, 2024 SEPTEMBER 1, 2035. Prior to
5	the repeal, the department of regulatory agencies shall review the
6	regulation of private occupational schools and their agents under this
7	article 64, including the functions of the division and the board, in
8	accordance with section 24-34-104.
9	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-64-116, amend
10	(1) as follows:
11	23-64-116. Application for change of ownership - definition.
12	(1) In the event of a change of ownership of a school, the seller, prior to
13	the effective date of the change of ownership, shall notify the board in
14	writing, and the buyer, prior to or within thirty days after the change of
15	ownership, shall make application APPLY for approval of the change of
16	ownership upon forms to be provided and in a manner prescribed by the
17	board. In the event of a THE BUYER'S OR SELLER'S failure to do so COMPLY
18	WITH THIS SUBSECTION (1), the school's certificate of approval shall be IS
19	suspended by operation of law until the application has been received and
20	approved by the board as provided in this section. THE CHANGE OF
21	OWNERSHIP MUST NOT OCCUR UNLESS THE BOARD GIVES PRIOR APPROVAL.
22	SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
23	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
24	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
25	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
26	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
27	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take

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- 1 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
- November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 3 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
