	A BILL FOR AN ACT
101	CONCERNING ADJUSTMENTS IN THE AMOUNT OF TOTAL PROGRAM
102	FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE 2017-18 BUDGET YEAR,
103	AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AND REDUCING AN
104	APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov/.)

Joint Budget Committee. The general assembly recognizes that the actual funded pupil count and the actual at-risk pupil count for the 2017-18 school year are lower than anticipated when the appropriation amount was established during the 2017 legislative session. In addition, local property tax and specific ownership tax receipts are more than anticipated, increasing the local share of total program funding. The bill declares the general assembly's intent to maintain the average amount of funding distributed per pupil on a statewide basis at the level of the original appropriation, resulting in a reduction in the budget stabilization factor. The bill adjusts the minimum amount of total program funding specified in statute to reflect this intent.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly finds and declares that:

- (a) The actual funded pupil count and the actual at-risk pupil count for the 2017-18 school year are lower than anticipated when the appropriation was established during the 2017 regular legislative session for total program funding for the 2017-18 budget year. As a result, total program funding is \$12,917,463 less than the appropriation made during the 2017 regular legislative session.
- (b) In addition, based on the actual amount of the local property tax and specific ownership tax receipts available to school districts for the 2017-18 budget year, the local share of total program funding is \$96,900,446 higher than anticipated when the appropriation for total program funding was established during the 2017 regular legislative session; and
- (c) It is the general assembly's intent to maintain total program funding at the level of the original appropriation, resulting in a reduction of the budget stabilization factor, and to adjust the minimum amount of total program funding specified in statute to reflect this intent.
 - (2) Now, therefore, the general assembly finds it necessary to

revise total program funding for the 2017-18 budget year.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-54-104, **amend** 3 (5)(g)(I)(H) as follows:

- **22-54-104. District total program definitions.** (5) For purposes of the formulas used in this section:
- (g) (I) For the 2010-11 budget year and each budget year thereafter, the general assembly determines that stabilization of the state budget requires a reduction in the amount of the annual appropriation to fund the state's share of total program funding for all districts and the funding for institute charter schools. The department of education shall implement the reduction in total program funding through the application of a budget stabilization factor as provided in this subsection (5)(g)(I). For the 2010-11 budget year and each budget year thereafter, the department of education and the staff of the legislative council shall determine, based on budget projections, the amount of such reduction to ensure the following:
 - (H) That, for the 2017-18 budget year, the sum of the total program funding for all districts, including the funding for institute charter schools, after application of the budget stabilization factor, is not less than six billion six hundred thirty-four million six hundred thousand one hundred eighty-two dollars (\$6,634,600,182) SIX BILLION SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-FOUR MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED SIXTY-TWO THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED EIGHTY-SEVEN DOLLARS (\$6,634,762,487); except that the department of education and the staff of the legislative council shall make mid-year revisions to replace projections with actual figures, including but not limited to actual pupil enrollment, assessed valuations, and specific ownership tax revenue from the prior year, to determine any

necessary changes in the amount of the reduction to maintain a total program funding amount for the applicable budget year that is consistent with this subsection (5)(g)(I)(H). For the 2018-19 budget year, the difference between calculated statewide total program funding and actual statewide total program funding must not exceed the difference between calculated statewide total program funding and actual statewide total program funding for the 2017-18 budget year.

FOOTNOTES -- The following statements are referenced to the numbered footnotes throughout section 2.

Department of Education, Assistance to Public Schools, Public School Finance, State Share of Districts' Total Program Funding -- Pursuant to Section 22-35-108 (2)(a), C.R.S., the purpose of this footnote is to specify what portion of this appropriation is intended to be available for the Accelerating Students Through Concurrent Enrollment (ASCENT) Program for FY 2017-18. It is the General Assembly's intent that the Department of Education be authorized to utilize up to \$4,210,800 \$4,218,000 of this appropriation to fund qualified students designated as ASCENT Program participants. This amount is calculated based on an estimated 600 FTE participants funded at a rate of \$7,018 \$7,030 per FTE pursuant to Section 22-54-104 (4.7), C.R.S.
