## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT ASSOCIATION
102 EMPLOYMENT AFTER RETIREMENT LIMITATIONS.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, the public employees' retirement association (PERA) limits the number of days that retired teachers can work as substitute teachers. The bill temporarily waives these limits for qualified service retirees in any school district while there are critical substitute teacher shortages.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	<b>SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.</b> (1) The general assembly
3	hereby finds and declares that in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic,
4	it has become increasingly apparent that there is a critical shortage of
5	qualified substitute teachers in all counties of the state.
6	(2) Therefore, the general assembly declares that during a critical
7	shortage of qualified substitute teachers it is necessary to waive the
8	employment after service retirement limits imposed on teacher service
9	retirees to allow qualified retired teachers to serve as substitute teachers.
10	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-51-1101, amend
11	(1) introductory portion and (1.8)(b); and <b>add</b> (1.3) as follows:
12	24-51-1101. Employment after service retirement - report -
13	definitions - repeal. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
14	(1.3), (1.8), (1.9), and (5) of this section or part 17 of this article 51, a
15	service retiree from any division may be employed by an employer,
16	whether or not in a position subject to membership, and receive a salary
17	without reduction in benefits if the service retiree has not worked for any
18	employer, as defined in section 24-51-101 (20), during the month of the
19	effective date of retirement, and if:
20	(1.3) (a) A SERVICE RETIREE WHO IS A TEACHER, AS DEFINED IN
21	SECTION 22-63-103 (11), MAY RECEIVE SALARY WITHOUT REDUCTION IN
22	BENEFITS IF:
23	$(I) \ The \ school \ district \ or \ charter \ school \ hires \ the \ service$
24	RETIREE FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING SUBSTITUTE TEACHER
25	CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION; AND
26	(II) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CHARTER SCHOOL HIRING THE

1	SERVICE RETIREE DETERMINES THAT THERE IS A CRITICAL SHORTAGE OF
2	QUALIFIED SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS AND THAT THE SERVICE RETIREE HAS
3	SPECIFIC EXPERIENCE, SKILLS, OR QUALIFICATIONS THAT WOULD BENEFIT
4	THE DISTRICT.
5	(b) As used in this subsection (1.3), "substitute teacher"
6	HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH IN SECTION 22-63-103 (10); EXCEPT
7	THAT THERE SHALL BE NO RESTRICTION IN THE LENGTH OF A CONTINUOUS
8	ASSIGNMENT.
9	(c) A SERVICE RETIREE WHO IS HIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH
10	SUBSECTION (1.3)(a) OF THIS SECTION DOES NOT COUNT AGAINST THE
11	ADDITIONAL TEN SERVICE RETIREES THAT A STATE COLLEGE OR
12	UNIVERSITY OR AN EMPLOYER IN THE SCHOOL OR DENVER PUBLIC
13	SCHOOLS DIVISION MAY HIRE AS AUTHORIZED BY SUBSECTION $(1.8)(b)$ of
14	THIS SECTION.
15	(d) This subsection $(1.3)$ is repealed, effective July 1, 2025.
16	(1.8) (b) A state college or university or an employer in the school
17	or Denver public schools division may hire up to ten service retirees who
18	are not subject to subsection (1.3), (1.9), or (5) of this section in areas
19	where the employer determines that there is a critical shortage of qualified
20	candidates and that the service retiree has unique experience, skill, or
21	qualifications that would benefit the employer. The employer shall notify
22	the association upon hiring a service retiree pursuant to this subsection
23	(1.8). A list of any and all service retirees employed by the employer shall
24	be provided to the association at the start of each calendar year and shall
25	be updated prior to any additional hirings during the same calendar year.
26	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
