### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING INCREASING THE NUMBER OF LICENSED PROFESSIONAL 102 COUNSELORS IN COMMUNITIES.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <a href="http://leg.colorado.gov">http://leg.colorado.gov</a>.)

The bill creates the dual licensure stipend program (stipend program) in the division of professions and occupations (division). The purpose of the stipend program is to increase the number of licensed professional counselors in communities by:

 Reimbursing licensed professional counselor supervisors (supervisors) who provide clinical supervision to school

- counselors who are seeking licensure as licensed professional counselors (dual licensure candidate); and
- Reimbursing dual licensure candidates for the cost of examination fees and application fees.

A dual licensure candidate is eligible for the stipend program if the dual licensure candidate is a licensed special services provider and has completed a master's or doctoral degree in professional counseling from an accredited school or college or an equivalent program.

The bill requires the division to contract with a Colorado nonprofit organization or membership organization (Colorado organization) to manage and administer the stipend program. The Colorado organization must have experience administrating grant programs and working with school counselors or mental health professionals.

The bill requires the division to provide the Colorado organization publicly available information on supervisors who can provide clinical supervision to dual licensure candidates. The Colorado organization shall maintain the list of supervisors by confirming whether a supervisor opts in to the stipend program and provides clinical supervision to dual licensure candidates. The Colorado organization shall determine a set rate for supervisors who provide clinical supervision to dual licensure candidates.

The bill requires the Colorado organization to annually collect data on:

- The number of dual licensure candidates participating in the stipend program;
- The number of supervisors participating in the stipend program; and
- The geographic locations of the dual licensure candidates and supervisors participating in the stipend program.

The Colorado organization shall draft a report summarizing the data collected. The bill requires the division to submit the report to the education committee and the public and behavioral health and human services committee of the house of representatives, the education committee and the health and human services committee of the senate, or their successor committees.

- Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

16	will help alleviate the mental and behavioral health workforce shortage
17	and provide mental and behavioral health supports for students.

(1) The general assembly 2 hereby finds that there are areas of Colorado that suffer from a lack of 3 health-care professionals, geriatric advanced practice providers, or AND 4 behavioral health-care providers to serve and a lack of nursing or other 5 health-care professional faculty to train health-care professionals to meet 6 AND SERVE the medical and behavioral health-care needs of communities. 7 The general assembly further finds that the state needs to implement 8 incentives to encourage health-care professionals, geriatric advanced 9 practice providers, and behavioral health-care providers to practice in 10 these underserved areas and to encourage nursing faculty and other 11 health-care professional faculty to teach health-care professionals. 12 (2) It is therefore the intent of the general assembly in enacting 13 this part 5 to create a state health service corps program that uses state 14 money; federal money, when permissible; and contributions from 15 communities and private sources to help repay the outstanding education 16 loans that many health-care professionals, geriatric advanced practice 17 providers, behavioral health-care providers, candidates for licensure, 18 nursing faculty, and health-care professional faculty hold. In exchange for 19 repayment of loans incurred for the purpose of obtaining education in 20 their chosen health-care, geriatric care, and OR behavioral health-care 21 professions, the health care professionals; geriatric advanced practice 22 providers, behavioral health-care providers, and candidates for licensure will commit to provide health care; geriatric care; or behavioral 23 24 health-care services, as applicable; in communities with underserved 25 health-care, geriatric care, or behavioral health-care needs throughout the 26 state, and the nursing and health-care professional faculty will commit to 27 provide a specified period of service in a qualified faculty position, AND
