starting in FY 2023-24 and ongoing as a result of reimbursements to local governments for the expanded property tax exemption. Further, a General Fund appropriation of \$39,363 would be required for the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs beginning in FY 2022-23 for workload costs associated with the expanded exemption.
