**BILL TOPIC: TENANCIES ONE MONTH TO ONE YEAR** 

NOTE: This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

#### **Summary of Legislation**

Under current law, for a tenancy of between one and six months, either the tenant or landlord may terminate the tenancy with 7 days notice. The bill extends this notice to 28 days. In addition, for tenancies between one month and one year where there is no written agreement between the landlord and tenant, the bill requires that a landlord give a tenant 28 days notice of a rent increase.

#### **Local Government Impact**

For local governments that serve as housing authorities and act as landlords, there may be a slight increase in costs to abide by the bill's provisions. Any increase is expected to be minimal.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate State, Veterans, and Military Affairs Committee on May 9, 2016.
