101	CONCERNING THE REPLACEMENT OF THE WORD "FOSTER" WITH
102	"ADMINISTER" IN STATUTE SO AS TO REQUIRE NEUTRAL
103	ADMINISTRATION BY THE COLORADO OIL AND GAS
104	CONSERVATION COMMISSION WITH RESPECT TO ITS OVERSIGHT
105	OF OIL AND GAS OPERATIONS.

Bill Summary

The bill implements a recommendation of the Colorado oil and gas task force to clarify the balanced responsibilities that the Colorado oil and

gas conservation commission has with respect to its oversight of oil and gas operations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 hereby finds and declares that: 4 (a) On September 8, 2014, Governor John W. Hickenlooper 5 established by executive order the Colorado Oil and Gas Task Force (task 6 force); 7 (b) Through the executive order, the governor charged the task 8 force with developing policy and legislative recommendations on a 9 number of issues involving oil and gas development in Colorado, 10 including the protection of public health and the environment and 11 encouraging responsible oil and gas development. A recommendation had 12 to meet the difficult standard of being approved by a two-thirds vote to 13 be submitted as a final recommendation. (c) The 21 members of the task force represented diverse interests 14 15 including the oil and gas industry, the agricultural industry, the 16 conservation community, and local government; 17 (d) One proposed recommendation that was approved by 13 of the 18 task force members, which represented 62 percent of the task force's 19 membership, concerned a clarification of the Colorado oil and gas 20 conservation commission's (commission) charge to provide balanced 21 oversight of oil and gas operations by substituting the word "administer" 22 for the word "foster" in the legislative declaration of the "Oil and Gas 23 Conservation Act"; and 24 (e) Implementing the proposed recommendation to clarify the commission's charge would honor the reasonable expectation of the 25

2	review of any oil and gas activity that could be hazardous to the public
3	health, safety, or welfare of the state.
4	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 34-60-102, amend
5	(1) (a) (I) as follows:
6	34-60-102. Legislative declaration. (1) (a) It is declared to be in
7	the public interest to:
8	(I) Foster ADMINISTER the responsible, balanced development,
9	production, and utilization of the natural resources of oil and gas in the
10	state of Colorado in a manner consistent with protection of public health,
11	safety, and welfare, including protection of the environment and wildlife
12	resources.
13	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
