## **Summary of Legislation**

The Office of School Safety in the Department of Public Safety (DPS) oversees the School Safety Resource Center that assists schools with crisis management and safety-related grant funding. Under current law, the School Resource Center Advisory Board makes recommendations and policy guidance for the resource center. This bill changes the name of the advisory board to the Office of School Safety Advisory Board and broadens the scope of the board's work to include policy recommendations for the entire Office of School Safety.

## **Assessment of No Fiscal Impact**

The bill expands the focus of the board to include all aspects of the Office of School Safety, but it makes no substantive changes to the size or composition of the advisory board, nor does it impact the administrative effort necessary to convene and conduct meetings. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

#### **Effective Date**

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on April 10, 2025.
