Bill Summary

The bill establishes an exemption from Colorado's "Consumer Repair Bill of Rights Act" (Act) for information technology equipment if the equipment meets certain criteria, such as whether:

- The equipment qualifies as critical infrastructure, as defined by federal law;
- The equipment is sold in a retail setting or only through business-to-business or business-to-government transactions; and
- Dissemination of the parts, documentation, embedded software, firmware, or tools required for the equipment would pose a security risk.

The attorney general may adopt rules for manufacturers of information technology equipment to submit requests for an exemption from the Act.

The bill clarifies the attorney general's responsibility regarding litigation on behalf of the state of Colorado or on behalf of the people of the state of Colorado.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

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3 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-31-101, **add** (5)
4 as follows:

5 **24-31-101. Powers and duties of attorney general.** (5) IN ANY
6 ACTION BROUGHT BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IN THE ATTORNEY
7 GENERAL'S OFFICIAL CAPACITY, OR ON THE RELATION OF THE STATE OF
8 COLORADO OR THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF COLORADO, TO ENFORCE THE
9 LAW AS AUTHORIZED BY STATUTE OR COMMON LAW, THE ATTORNEY
10 GENERAL SHALL NOT BE DEEMED TO PURSUE AN ACTION ON BEHALF OF
11 ANY OTHER STATE OFFICER OR ANY STATE AGENCY, DEPARTMENT, OFFICE,
12 BOARD, COMMISSION, OR ENTERPRISE AND SHALL NOT BE DEEMED IN
13 POSSESSION, CUSTODY, OR CONTROL OF ANY RECORD THAT IS MADE, KEPT,
14 OR MAINTAINED BY ANY OTHER STATE OFFICER OR ANY STATE AGENCY,
15 DEPARTMENT, OFFICE, BOARD, COMMISSION, OR ENTERPRISE FOR THE
16 PURPOSE OF ANY DISCOVERY REQUEST DIRECTED AT THE ATTORNEY
17 GENERAL IN THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICIAL CAPACITY, OR ON THE

1 RELATION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO OR THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF
2 COLORADO, AS A PARTY TO SUCH ACTION.

3 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds,
4 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
5 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
6 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
7 institutions.
