WHEREAS, Children are key to Colorado's future success, prosperity, and quality of life; while children are our most precious
resource, they are also our most vulnerable; and
WHEREAS, Child abuse and neglect is a serious and reprehensible

WHEREAS, In 2014, there were nearly 10,000 confirmed cases of
child abuse and neglect in Colorado, and 20 children died as a result; in
the United States there were over 700,000 confirmed cases of child abuse
and neglect, and 1,580 children died as a result; and

1 2 3 4 5	WHEREAS, Groundbreaking studies, like the Adverse Childhood Experiences Study, have revealed the significant, increased long-term health and mental health risks to children exposed to traumatic adverse experiences, including heart disease, chronic lung disease, liver disease, and suicide; and
