SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 22-003

CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF COLORADO 4-H DAY.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, The Colorado 4-H Youth Development program is founded on the notion that youth are a vital resource for ensuring a better tomorrow, and assisting youth as they prepare for the future is the 4-H program's central mission; and
5 6 7	WHEREAS, The Colorado 4-H program is an integral part of Colorado State University Extension and is fundamental to the land-grant university mission; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS, More than 110,000 Colorado youth, with the guidance of more than 10,000 adult and youth volunteer leaders, currently contribute to their communities and gain practical experience in

workforce preparation and career exploration through 4-H projects and

2 3	essential life skills like confidence, courage, resilience, and curiosity and prepares them for life today and tomorrow; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, 4-H serves every county and parish in America through a network of 100 land-grant universities and the Cooperative Extension System with 3,000 county offices nationwide; and
7 8 9 10	WHEREAS, The 4-H organization is led by a unique public-private partnership that includes the National 4-H Council and the National Institute of Food and Agriculture within the United States Department of Agriculture; and
11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, Colorado 4-H returns an estimated \$45 million annually to the Colorado economy, plus \$31 million in added value through volunteer time contributions, resulting in a ten-fold return on investment based on the cost to conduct the program; and
15 16 17 18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, A decade-long longitudinal study of positive youth development showed that, compared to their peers, youth involved in 4-H programs are: Nearly twice as likely to be civically active (grades 8-12); nearly twice as likely to make healthier choices (grade 7); nearly twice as likely to participate in science, engineering, and computer technology programs during time outside of school (grades 10-12); and nearly 4 times more likely to make contributions to their communities (grades 7-12); and
22 23 24	WHEREAS, Participation in 4-H in Colorado is open to youth from the ages of 5 to 19 from all economic, social, and cultural backgrounds; now, therefore,

8 9 10	(2) That the General Assembly hereby declares Monday, January 31, 2022, to be "Colorado 4-H Day" in recognition of the 4-H program's efforts on behalf of Colorado's youth.

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
