**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101     **CONCERNING ACCESS TO THE ELECTRONIC PRESCRIPTION DRUG  
102     MONITORING PROGRAM.**

**Bill Summary**

The bill modifies provisions relating to licensed health professionals' access to the electronic prescription drug monitoring program as follows:

- ! Allows a health care provider who has authority to prescribe controlled substances, or the provider's designee, to query the program regarding a current patient, regardless

of whether the provider is prescribing or considering prescribing a controlled substance to that patient;

- ! Specifies that a veterinarian who is authorized to prescribe controlled substances may access the program to inquire about a current patient or client if the veterinarian suspects that the client has committed drug abuse or mistreated an animal; and
- ! Specifies that, in addition to accessing the program when dispensing or considering dispensing a controlled substance, a pharmacist or designee of the pharmacist may access the program regarding a current patient to whom the pharmacist is dispensing or considering dispensing a prescription drug.

1       *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2           **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-42.5-404, **amend**  
3       (3)(b) and (3)(d); and **add** (3)(b.5) as follows:

4           **12-42.5-404. Program operation - access - rules - definitions.**

5       (3) The program is available for query only to the following persons or  
6       groups of persons:

7           (b) Any practitioner with the statutory authority to prescribe  
8       controlled substances, or an individual designated by the practitioner to  
9       act on his or her behalf in accordance with section 12-42.5-403 (1.5)(b),  
10      to the extent the query relates to a current patient of the practitioner; ~~to~~  
11      ~~whom the practitioner is prescribing or considering prescribing any~~  
12      ~~controlled substance;~~

13           (b.5) (I) ANY VETERINARIAN WITH STATUTORY AUTHORITY TO  
14       PRESCRIBE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES, TO THE EXTENT THE QUERY  
15       RELATES TO A CURRENT PATIENT OR TO A CLIENT AND IF THE  
16       VETERINARIAN, IN THE EXERCISE OF PROFESSIONAL JUDGMENT, HAS A  
17       REASONABLE BASIS TO SUSPECT THE CLIENT HAS COMMITTED DRUG ABUSE  
18       OR HAS MISTREATED AN ANIMAL.

2 (A) "CLIENT" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH IN SECTION  
3 12-64-103 (4.3).

4 (B) "MISTREAT" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH IN  
5 SECTION 35-42-103 (9).

6 (C) "PATIENT" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH IN SECTION  
7 12-64-103 (9.7).

15                   **SECTION 2. Applicability.** This act applies to queries to the  
16                   electronic prescription drug monitoring program occurring on or after the  
17                   effective date of this act.

18                   **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
19                   determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
20                   preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
