### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

#### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment J.001 (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$154,164 cash funds from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2018-19. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Regulatory Agencies will require an additional 1.8 FTE. The amendment also appropriates a total of \$52,104, including \$41,448 General Fund and \$10,656 reappropriated funds, to the Department of Law for FY 2018-19. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Law will require an additional 0.4 FTE. The reappropriated funds to the Department of Law are from the Department of Regulatory Agencies.

#### **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2018-19 based on the March 2018 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The budget package leaves approximately \$40.8 million General Fund unallocated. Thus, the General Assembly could appropriate up to \$38.3 million General Fund to fund 2018 legislation and maintain a 6.5 percent General Fund reserve. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$41,448 for FY 2018-19, reducing the excess General Fund reserve by \$44,142.
