### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$22,500 General Fund to the Department of Human Services for FY 2021-22.

L.002 Bill Sponsor amendment L.002 (attached) amends the Public & Behavioral Health & Human Services Committee Report, dated March 16, 2021, to correct existing language in the bill. Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that L.002 does not change the fiscal impact of the bill.

### **Points to Consider**

### General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the March 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package includes a set aside of \$50.0 million General Fund for bills that require General Fund appropriations for FY 2021-22. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$22,500 for FY 2021-22, reducing the \$50.0 million set aside by the same amount.
