## **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

#### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment J.001 (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$1,159 cash funds from the marijuana cash fund to the Department of Revenue for FY 2017-18, and to authorize the Department of Public Safety to receive and spend this amount.

#### **Points to Consider**

#### TABOR/ Excess State Revenues Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2017-18 based on the March 2017 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. This bill is projected to increase cash fund revenues by \$3,359 for FY 2017-18, which would increase the amount required to be refunded under TABOR based on this revenue forecast. As TABOR refunds are paid from the General Fund, this bill would reduce the amount of General Fund available for other purposes.
