The bill transfers \$5 million for air quality enforcement activities in FY 2025-26.

State Transfers

On July 1, 2025, the bill transfers \$5 million from the General Fund to the Stationary Sources Control Fund in the Department of Public Health and Environment.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
