#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING REQUIREMENTS FOR ONLINE MARKETPLACES WITH 102 RESPECT TO THIRD-PARTY SELLERS.

### **Bill Summary**

The bill requires an online marketplace to alert a law enforcement agency if the online marketplace knows or should have known that a third-party seller is selling or attempting to sell stolen goods to a consumer in Colorado.

An online marketplace is required to establish:

• A mechanism that allows the online marketplace to timely

- and confidentially communicate with a law enforcement agency; and
- Internal policies, systems, and staff to monitor product listings to detect and prevent organized retail crime.

official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
