After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:
HB24-1276 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee on <u>Appropriations</u> with favorable recommendation:
Amend reengrossed bill, page 2, before line 2, insert: "SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly finds and declares that: (a) The Colorado commission for the deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind was established to facilitate the provision of state and local government services to the deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind, while making government more efficient; (b) Under the federal "Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990",
42 U.S.C. sec. 12101 et seq., as amended, Colorado has a duty to provide equivalent access to state government and public accommodations to the deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind;
(c) This duty requires state departments and agencies to provide auxiliary services, communications technology equipment, and other resources to ensure access;
(d) Auxiliary services include sign language interpretation services, real-time captioning services, and other vital communication aids and access services;
(e) These services are necessary for people who are deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind to communicate effectively with one another; and (f) The state of Colorado does not have a centralized, statewide system to provide communication access services for the deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind.
(2) Therefore, the general assembly declares that the Colorado commission for the deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind in the department of human services, in collaboration with the department of personnel and administration and the department of labor and employment, shall consult and make recommendations to the general assembly and the governor's

office on how to establish a centralized, statewide auxiliary services

- 2 departments and agencies, including the governor's office, that employ or
- 3 serve individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing, or deafblind.".
