Summary Information

Overview. The bill requires local education providers to adopt policies that allow youth service organizations to present to students.

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Summary of Legislation

The bill requires each institute charter school, district charter school, and local board of education to adopt a policy that allows youth service organizations to present to students on campus during the school day about available opportunities. At minimum, the policy must outline the process for organizations to notify the school of their interest in presenting. Schools must adopt the policy and post it on their website by January 1, 2026.

School District

Workload will increase for schools to develop the policy, establish internal processes for youth organization presentations, and ensure the policy posted to its website. This workload increase is expected to be minimal.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
