The Senate Education Committee Report (04/18/18) and the Senate Appropriations Committee Report (04/24/18) include amendments to the bill. The Senate Education Committee Report (04/18/18) includes amendments which require students to obtain a criminal history record check directly from the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI), rather than through the Department of Education (CDE). This eliminates the need for an appropriation to CDE and changes the fund source of the appropriation to the CBI from reappropriated funds to cash funds. Legislative Council Staff agrees with this updated fiscal impact.

Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriations clause that appropriates \$34,065 cash funds from the CBI Identification Unit Cash Fund to the Department of Public Safety for FY 2018-19.
