	A BILL FOR AN ACT
101	CONCERNING ADDITIONAL CRITERIA REGARDING WHO THE GOVERNOR
102	MAY APPOINT AS MEMBERS OF THE BOARD THAT OVERSEES THE
103	COLORADO HEALTH INSURANCE AFFORDABILITY ENTERPRISE.

### **Bill Summary**

The bill adds additional criteria regarding who the governor may appoint as members of the health insurance affordability board, which is the board that oversees the Colorado health insurance affordability enterprise.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	<b>SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.</b> (1) The general assembly
3	finds and declares that:
4	(a) Rural communities are an invaluable component of Colorado's
5	culture, economy, and public health landscape;
6	(b) Rural communities disproportionately face financial and
7	accessibility obstacles to health coverage;
8	(c) The 2026 rate increases for private health insurance plans for
9	the individual market are projected to vary based on geographic area, with
10	average rates projected to increase by:
11	(I) 25.4% in the Denver area;
12	(II) 33.4% in eastern Colorado; and
13	(III) 38.8% in western Colorado;
14	(d) These significant cost impacts for rural communities
15	demonstrate a need for additional rural representation on the health
16	insurance affordability board to ensure residents in rural areas are
17	protected from health insurance coverage loss;
18	(e) The health insurance affordability board directly allocates
19	funding to facilitate reductions in premiums and avoid health insurance
20	coverage loss;
21	(f) Rural and republican representation on the health insurance
22	affordability board is essential to ensure the allocation of these funds
23	prioritizes documented Colorado citizens and our most vulnerable rural
24	communities;
25	(g) Colorado must continue to identify avenues to increase rural
26	participation in health care to ensure all documented communities within

the state have access;

- (h) The general assembly can no longer marginalize rural voices and the communities that feed, power, and clothe the rest of the state; and
- (i) By requiring geographic and political diversity on the health insurance affordability board, Colorado can require that the governor appoint members who adequately address all concerns regarding health insurance coverage by protecting all taxpaying Coloradans who are at risk of losing their health insurance coverage and representing the interests of rural communities throughout the state.
  - **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 10-16-1207, **amend** (1)(b); and **add** (1)(a.5) as follows:
  - 10-16-1207. Health insurance affordability board creation membership powers and duties subject to open meetings and public records laws commissioner rules. (1) (a.5) IN EXERCISING THE GOVERNOR'S AUTHORITY TO APPOINT NINE OF THE MEMBERS TO THE BOARD PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1)(a)(III) OF THIS SECTION, THE GOVERNOR SHALL SELECT THE NINE MEMBERS IN A MANNER THAT RESULTS IN THE BOARD CONSISTING OF FOUR MEMBERS WHO ARE REGISTERED DEMOCRATS, FOUR MEMBERS WHO ARE REGISTERED REPUBLICANS, AND ONE MEMBER WHO IS UNAFFILIATED.
  - (b) To the extent possible, the governor shall attempt to appoint board members who reflect the diversity of the state with regard to race, ethnicity, immigration status, income, wealth, ability, and geography. In considering geographic diversity, the governor shall ensure at least one member resides on the eastern plains IN A COUNTY WITH NO MORE THAN FIFTY THOUSAND RESIDENTS AT THE TIME OF THE APPOINTMENT and one member resides on the western slope IN A COUNTY WITH NO MORE THAN

FIFTY THOUSAND RESIDENTS AT THE TIME OF THE APPOINTMENT and, to the extent possible, shall attempt to appoint members from each congressional district in the state.

**SECTION 3.** Act subject to petition - effective date - applicability. (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

(2) This act applies to board appointments made on or after the applicable effective date of this act.
