CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023. In Session Laws of Colorado 2023, section 2 of chapter 474, (SB 23-214), amend Part XXI as follows:
