# **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill includes an appropriation clause that appropriates a total of \$38,149 cash funds from the Division of Insurance Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2025-26. The appropriation reflects 0.4 FTE.

# **Points to Consider**

### **General Fund Impact**

Pursuant to Section 10-3-209 (4), C.R.S., taxes on insurance premiums are credited to the Division of Insurance Cash Fund (with a maximum transfer of five percent of premium tax collections) to cover appropriations made by the General Assembly. Any increase in appropriations reduces the amount of tax

revenue deposited in the General Fund, thereby reducing the amount of General Fund available for other purposes.

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2025-26 based on the March 2025 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$18.2 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders.

This bill reduces General Fund revenues by \$45,928 in FY 2025-26, reducing the \$18.2 million set aside by the same amount.
