	SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 21-020
101	CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF THE OVERPASS OF STATE
102	HIGHWAY 115 THAT CROSSES OVER UNITED STATES HIGHWAY
103	50 IN FREMONT COUNTY, COLORADO, AS THE "DEPUTY
104	SHERIFF JASON SCHWARTZ MEMORIAL BRIDGE".
1 2	WHEREAS, Fremont County Deputy Sheriff Jason Schwartz was shot and killed in the line of duty on September 28, 2001; and
3 4	WHEREAS, Deputy Sheriff Schwartz was murdered while transporting two arrestees to jail; and
5 6 7	WHEREAS, While being transported in the back of Deputy Sheriff Schwartz's patrol car, one of the two arrestees, who was in possession of two handguns and a makeshift handcuff key, was able to free himself; and

1 2 3	WHEREAS, The men shot Deputy Sheriff Schwartz four times through a gap in the patrol car's cage, then pulled his body from the vehicle and shot him eight more times before fleeing; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, In the terrorizing hours that followed, the arrestees went on to engage local law enforcement with active gunfire, wounding three of them; and
7 8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, Corporal Toby Bethel of the Florence Police Department was critically injured during an ambush, Chief Mike Ingle of the Florence Police Department was injured by flying glass debris while under fire, and Fremont County Sheriff Deputy Orozco was shot in the left arm; and
12 13	WHEREAS, Following an intensive manhunt, the killers were apprehended and subsequently sentenced to life in prison; and
14 15 16	WHEREAS, Deputy Sheriff Schwartz had served with the Fremont County Sheriff's Department for one year and had served in law enforcement for four years; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, At the time of the attack on Deputy Sheriff Schwartz, his patrol car was located under the overpass at State Highway 115 and United States Highway 50; and
20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, Each year, a small group of those who responded that day, including Deputy Sheriff Schwartz's wife and son, who was only two weeks old at the time of his father's murder, gather at the overpass for a moment of silence; and
24 25 26	WHEREAS, It is only fitting that Deputy Sheriff Schwartz's dedication and ultimate sacrifice be recognized so that we may never forget his service to the people of the state of Colorado; now, therefore,
27 28 29	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
30 31	(1) That the overpass of State Highway 115 that crosses over United States Highway 50 in Fremont County, Colorado, be designated as the "Deputy Sheriff Jason Schwartz Memorial Bridge"

(2) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may accept
and expend gifts, grants, and donations for the purposes of the initial
placement of signs to mark the overpass of State Highway 115 that
crosses over United States Highway 50 in Fremont County, Colorado, as
the "Deputy Sheriff Jason Schwartz Memorial Bridge".
(3) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may explore
a cooperative agreement with the Board of County Commissioners for

a cooperative agreement with the Board of County Commissioners for Fremont County for the maintenance of the signs marking the "Deputy Sheriff Jason Schwartz Memorial Bridge".
