### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CHANGING THE MAXIMUM JAIL SENTENCE FOR CERTAIN
102 CRIMES FROM ONE YEAR TO THREE HUNDRED SIXTY-FOUR DAYS.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, the maximum jail sentence for a class 2 misdemeanor, misdemeanors without a fixed statutory penalty, and municipal ordinance violations is one year. The bill changes the maximum jail sentence to 364 days.
