The bill expands the conduct that can constitute the crime of obstructing governmental operations to include the repeated calling of 911 dispatch centers without justifiable cause.

takes effect October 1, 2025; except that, if a referendum petition is filed 1 2 pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this 3 act or an item, section, or part of this act within the ninety-day period 4 after final adjournment of the general assembly, then the act, item, 5 section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the 6 general election to be held in November 2026 and, in such case, will take 7 effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the 8 governor.
