AN ACT

CONCERNING FUNDING FOR CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, AND MAKING  
SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

**SECTION 1. Capital construction information technology appropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024.** In Session Laws of Colorado 2024, **amend** section 4 of chapter 519, (HB 24-1430), as follows:
