### **Summary Information**

**Overview**. The bill repeals the Commodity Metals Theft Task Force.

**No fiscal impact.** The bill repeals a task force that is scheduled to repeal under current law; thus, the bill has no fiscal impact on state or local government revenue or expenditures.

# **Summary of Legislation**

The bill repeals sections of state law related to the Commodity Metals Theft Task Force in the Colorado Department of Public Safety (CDPS). It is currently scheduled to repeal on September 1, 2025.

# **Background**

The Commodity Metals Theft Task Force in the Colorado State Patrol in CDPS is charged with discussing issues related to the theft of commodity metals, including catalytic converter theft, and identifying ways to reduce such thefts. The sunset report for the task force is available on the Department of Regulatory Agencies <u>website</u>.

# **Assessment of No Fiscal Impact**

The bill repeals the provisions of state law associated with a task force that is set to repeal under current law. CDPS has minimal workload associated with supporting the Commodity Metals Theft Task Force; this workload will be eliminated regardless of whether the bill is enacted. As a result, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 17, 2025, and takes effect on August 6, 2025, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
