A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING MEASURES TO INFORM STUDENTS OF EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES LEADING TO JOBS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill requires a school district, board of cooperative services, or charter school (local education provider) that provides concurrent enrollment to provide a notice to students and parents twice each year that explains the number of credits and types of credentials a student may earn through concurrent enrollment and the types of jobs that are available to persons who hold those types of credentials. The bill requires the

postsecondary and work force readiness statewide coordinator to provide information to local education providers concerning the types of jobs that require the certificates that are available through concurrent enrollment and the availability of those jobs around the state.

If a student chooses to follow a career pathway created by the state work force development council, the bill requires a student's individual career and academic plan (ICAP) to include the student's progress in completing the courses and other learning experiences outlined in the pathway. In assisting a student and his or her parent in creating the ICAP, the public school must explain to the student and parent the various career pathways and the types of certificates and jobs to which the pathways lead and discuss the skills and educational opportunities available through military enlistment.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-35-104, **amend** 3 (1)(b)(I) as follows:

22-35-104. Enrollment in an institution of higher education - cooperative agreement. (1) (b) (I) Each local education provider shall annually notify all students and parents or legal guardians of students enrolled in the local education provider of the opportunity for concurrent enrollment by qualified students in postsecondary courses, including academic courses and career and technical education courses, which may include course work related to apprenticeship programs and internship programs. Each Local Education Provider Shall Provide the Notice At Least Twice During Each School Year. At a minimum, the Notice Must explain to parents, Legal Guardians, and Students:

- (A) THE NUMBER OF POSTSECONDARY COURSE CREDITS A
 QUALIFIED STUDENT MAY CONCURRENTLY ENROLL IN EACH SCHOOL YEAR
 WHILE THE QUALIFIED STUDENT IS ENROLLED IN HIGH SCHOOL;
- (B) The types of Career Pathways Developed Pursuant to Section 24-46.3-104 that a student may participate in through

14	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-46.3-302, amend
15	(2)(a)(II) as follows:
16	24-46.3-302. Postsecondary and work force readiness
17	statewide coordinator - position created - duties. (2) (a) The statewide
18	coordinator shall assist local education providers in:
19	(II) Implementing concurrent enrollment programs as provided in
20	article 35 of title 22 C.R.S., and in entering into concurrent enrollment
21	agreements with area technical colleges, community colleges, and
22	four-year institutions of higher education. TO ASSIST LOCAL EDUCATION
23	PROVIDERS IN PROVIDING INFORMATION CONCERNING CONCURRENT
24	ENROLLMENT OPPORTUNITIES TO STUDENTS AND PARENTS, THE STATEWIDE
25	COORDINATOR SHALL CORRELATE CERTIFICATES THAT STUDENTS MAY
26	EARN THROUGH CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT AND CAREER PATHWAYS

4	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-2-136, add
5	(2)(a)(II.5) as follows:

8	individual career and academic plans, the state board shall ensure, at a
9	minimum, that:
10	(a) Each individual career and academic plan includes a career
11	planning and guidance component and a portfolio that reflects, at a
12	minimum:

17	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-30.5-525, amend
18	(1) as follows:
19	22-30.5-525. Individual career and academic plans. (1) Each
20	institute charter school shall assist each student and his or her parent or
21	legal guardian to develop and maintain the student's individual career and
22	academic plan, referred to in this section as an "ICAP", no later than the
23	beginning of ninth grade but may assist the student and his or her parent
24	or legal guardian to develop and maintain the student's ICAP in any grade
25	prior to ninth grade. IN ASSISTING A STUDENT AND HIS OR HER PARENT OR
26	LEGAL GUARDIAN IN CREATING AND MAINTAINING THE ICAP, THE
27	INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL SHALL, AT A MINIMUM, DISCUSS WITH THE

14	developing and maintaining each student's ICAP, the counselor or teacher
15	explains to the student's parent or legal guardian, by electronic mail or
16	other written form, and to the student:
17	(A) The requirements for and benefits of concurrently enrolling
18	in courses with an institution of higher education pursuant to the
19	"Concurrent Enrollment Programs Act", article 35 of this title TITLE 22.
20	Based on a request from the student or the student's parent or legal
21	guardian, the counselor or teacher shall assist the student in course
22	planning to enable the student to concurrently enroll in courses with an
23	institution of higher education.
24	(B) THE VARIOUS CAREER PATHWAYS CREATED PURSUANT TO
25	SECTION 24-46.3-104 AND THE TYPES OF CERTIFICATES AND JOBS TO
26	WHICH EACH PATHWAY LEADS; AND

THROUGH MILITARY ENLISTMENT.

SECTION 6. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10, 2017); except that, if a
referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
