A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING REPEALING THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT CONFIRM CERTAIN PERSONS' STATUSES BEFORE ISSUANCE OF AN IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENT.

Bill Summary

Under existing law, the department of revenue (department) is required to issue a driver's license, instruction permit, or identification card (identification documents) to a person who is lawfully present in the United States if:

• The individual qualifies for the identification document;

- The individual produces documents that satisfy the department that the individual is lawfully present; and
- The federal government confirms the individual's status, including electronically through the federal systematic alien verification for entitlements (SAVE) system.

The bill repeals the requirement that the federal government confirm the individual's status.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 42-2-506 as
3	follows:
4	42-2-506. Identification documents - individuals temporarily
5	lawfully present. (1) An individual who is temporarily present in the
6	United States may apply for an identification document under PURSUANT
7	TO this section. The department shall issue an identification document if
8	THE INDIVIDUAL:
9	(a) The individual:
10	(1) (a) Qualifies for the document applied for except for
11	qualifications that conflict with this section; and
12	(H) (b) Produces documents that satisfy the department that the
13	individual is lawfully present in the United States. and
14	(b) The federal government confirms the individual's status,
15	including electronically through the SAVE system.
16	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
17	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
18	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
