Bill Summary

Joint Budget Committee. The bill requires the state treasurer to transfer \$6 million from the general fund to the hazardous substance response fund on July 1, 2025.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-16-104.6, **add**
3 (1)(g) as follows:

4 **25-16-104.6. Fund established - administration - revenue**
5 **sources - use - repeal.** (1) (g) (I) ON JULY 1, 2025, THE STATE
6 TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER SIX MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL
7 FUND TO THE HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE RESPONSE FUND.

8 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (1)(g) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026.

9 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds,
10 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
12 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
13 institutions.
