A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING THE CREATION OF A SUBMARINE SERVICE LICENSE PLATE
102	TO HONOR THE SERVICE OF SUBMARINE VETERANS, AND, IN
103	CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill creates the submarine service license plate. In addition to the standard motor vehicle fees, the plate requires 2 one-time fees of \$25. One fee is credited to the highway users tax fund and the other to a fund that provides licensing services.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. The Colorado General
3	Assembly hereby recognizes the unique role that the United States Navy
4	submarine service provides our nation's armed forces. This act creates a
5	commemorative license plate to honor the service of submarine veterans.
6	Founded in 1900, the "silent service" is an all volunteer force, with
7	members who are accepted only after rigorous testing and observation. A
8	submariner must earn their "dolphins" once aboard, signifying their
9	in-depth knowledge of shipboard systems, allowing their fellow
10	submariners to feel secure that their lives are safe in each other's hands.
11	The submariner's motto is "Pride Runs Deep".

9	THE APPLICANT IS A VETERAN, RESERVE MEMBER, OR ACTIVE MEMBER OF
10	THE SUBMARINE SERVICE OF THE UNITED STATES NAVY.
11	SECTION 3. Appropriation. For the 2018-19 state fiscal year,
12	\$2,960 is appropriated to the department of revenue. This appropriation
13	is from the license plate cash fund created in section 42-3-301 (1)(b),
14	C.R.S. To implement this act, the department may use this appropriation
15	for license plate ordering.
16	SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
17	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
18	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
19	8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a
20	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
21	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
22	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
23	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
24	November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the

official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
