#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING MULTIPLE APPROACHES TO HELP PREVENT YOUTH SUICIDE.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires the office of suicide prevention (office) in the department of public health and environment (department) to work with appropriate entities to develop and implement a plan to provide access to training programs related to youth suicide prevention for people who regularly interact with youth but who are not in a profession that typically provides such training opportunities, such as camp counselors, recreation

center employees, youth group leaders, clergy, and parents. The office is required to approve at least 3 nonprofit organizations statewide to participate in a coordinated program of youth suicide prevention training. Classes and programs offered by the approved nonprofit organizations must be free to the public, and the department shall reimburse the approved nonprofit organization for any direct or indirect costs associated with such classes and programs.

The bill further directs the department to coordinate efforts to create and implement a statewide awareness campaign about suicide and youth suicide prevention, as well as awareness of the suicide prevention hotline. The awareness campaign may include, but is not limited to, the use of written, electronic, radio, and television media.

The age of consent for a minor to seek and obtain outpatient psychotherapy services is lowered from 15 years of age or older to 12 years of age and older. The licensed mental health provider is immune from civil or criminal liability for providing outpatient psychotherapy services unless he or she acts negligently or outside the scope of his or her practice.

The bill clarifies that the age of consent for a minor seeking inpatient psychotherapy or other inpatient mental health services without the consent of a parent or legal guardian remains 15 years of age or older.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-1.5-112, add (2)(d) as follows:

25-1.5-112. Colorado suicide and youth suicide prevention

plan - established - goals - responsibilities - reporting - funding.

(2) The suicide prevention commission, together with the office of suicide prevention, the office of behavioral health, the department, and the department of health care policy and financing, is strongly encouraged to collaborate with criminal justice and health care systems, mental and behavioral health systems, primary care providers, physical and mental health clinics in educational institutions, community mental health centers, advocacy groups, emergency medical services professionals and responders, public and private insurers, hospital chaplains, and

15	NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION TO OFFER SUCH TRAINING THROUGH AN
16	EXISTING STATEWIDE COORDINATED MODEL.
17	(II) On or before October 1, 2018, and every quarter
18	THEREAFTER, THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION SHALL POST ON ITS
19	WEBSITE A LIST OF SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING CLASSES OR PROGRAMS
20	OFFERED BY NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS THROUGHOUT THE STATE THAT
21	HAVE BEEN APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
22	(III) THE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION WITH WHICH THE OFFICE OF
23	SUICIDE PREVENTION ENTERED INTO A CONTRACT PURSUANT TO
24	SUBSECTION $(2)(d)(I)$ OF THIS SECTION SHALL PROVIDE EVIDENCE-BASED
25	AND CULTURALLY SENSITIVE TRAINING CLASSES OR PROGRAMS, IN BOTH
26	ENGLISH AND SPANISH, AT NO CHARGE TO THE PUBLIC, AND THE
27	DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE COMPENSATION TO SUCH NONPROFIT

2	TRAINING CLASSES OR PROGRAMS.
3	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-1.5-101, amend
4	(1)(w) as follows:
5	25-1.5-101. Powers and duties of department - laboratory cash
6	fund - report. (1) The department has, in addition to all other powers
7	and duties imposed upon it by law, the powers and duties provided in this
8	section as follows:
9	(w) (I) To act OPERATE THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION,
10	WHICH IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED IN THE DIVISION OF PREVENTION SERVICES
11	IN THE DEPARTMENT, THAT SERVES as the coordinator for suicide
12	prevention programs throughout the state, including the Colorado suicide
13	prevention plan established in section 25-1.5-112.
14	(II) The department is authorized to accept gifts, grants, and
15	donations to assist it in performing its duties as the coordinator ON
16	BEHALF OF THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION AND for suicide prevention
17	programs. All such gifts, grants, and donations shall be transmitted to the
18	state treasurer who shall credit the same to the suicide prevention
19	coordination cash fund, which fund is hereby created AND REFERRED TO
20	IN THIS SUBSECTION (1)(w) AS THE "FUND". The fund also consists of any
21	money appropriated or transferred to the fund by the general assembly for
22	the purposes of implementing section 25-1.5-112. Any moneys MONEY
23	remaining in the suicide prevention coordination cash fund at the end of
24	any fiscal year shall remain REMAINS in the fund and shall MUST not be
25	transferred or credited to the general fund. The general assembly shall
26	make appropriations from the suicide prevention coordination cash fund
27	for expenditures incurred by the department OR THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE

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PREVENTION in the performance of its duties under PURSUANT TO this paragraph (w) SUBSECTION (1)(w) and section 25-1.5-112.

(III) (A) Notwithstanding section 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), as part of its THE duties as coordinator for suicide prevention programs OF THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION, on or before each November 1, the department OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION shall submit to the chairs of the senate health and human services committee, and the house of representatives health, insurance, and environment committee, AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES PUBLIC HEALTH CARE AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE, or their successor committees, and to the members of the joint budget committee, a report listing all suicide prevention programs in the state and describing the effectiveness of the department OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION IN acting as the coordinator for suicide prevention programs. For the report submitted in 2013 and each year thereafter, the department OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION shall include any findings and recommendations it has to improve suicide prevention in the state.

(IV) In its role as coordinator for suicide prevention programs, the department OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION may collaborate with each facility licensed or certified pursuant to section 25-1.5-103 in order to coordinate suicide prevention services, including relevant training and other services as part of the Colorado suicide prevention plan established in section 25-1.5-112, INCLUDING THE PLAN TO INCREASE ACCESS TO SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING PROGRAMS, AS SET FORTH IN SECTION 25-1.5-112 (2)(d). When a facility treats a person OR YOUTH who has attempted suicide or exhibits a suicidal gesture, the facility may provide oral and written information or educational materials to the person or, in

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whom the minor will be released, prior to the person's release, regarding warning signs of depression, risk factors of suicide, methods of preventing suicide, available suicide prevention resources, and any other information concerning suicide awareness and prevention. The department OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION may work with facilities and the Colorado suicide prevention plan to determine whether and where gaps exist in suicide prevention programs and services, including gaps that may be present in:

- (A) The information and materials being used and distributed in facilities throughout the state;
- (B) Resources available to persons, INCLUDING YOUTH, who attempt suicide or exhibit a suicidal gesture and, when the person is a minor, to parents, relatives, and other responsible persons to whom a minor is released; and
- (C) The process for referring persons, INCLUDING YOUTH, who attempt suicide or exhibit a suicidal gesture to suicide prevention services and programs or other appropriate health care providers for treatment.
- (V) IN ITS ROLE AS COORDINATOR FOR SUICIDE PREVENTION PROGRAMS, THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION SHALL WORK WITH THE COLORADO YOUTH ADVISORY COUNCIL, CREATED IN SECTION 2-2-1302, AND THE YOUTH SUICIDE PREVENTION WORKGROUP OF THE SUICIDE PREVENTION COMMISSION TO ADVISE THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION IN THE CREATION AND DEVELOPMENT OF A YOUTH-FRIENDLY AND CULTURALLY SENSITIVE WEBSITE THAT SERVES AS A CLEARINGHOUSE FOR ACCESS TO PREEXISTING MENTAL HEALTH RESOURCES AVAILABLE THROUGHOUT COLORADO. THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION SHALL

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1	CREATE THE WEBSITE ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2019, AND SHALL BE
2	RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING CURRENT INFORMATION ON THE WEBSITE.
3	THE WEBSITE MUST BE ACCESSIBLE TO BOTH ENGLISH- AND

5	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-43-201, amend
6	(9)(a) as follows:
7	12-43-201. Definitions. As used in this article 43, unless the
8	context otherwise requires:
9	(9) (a) "Psychotherapy", OR "PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES", means
10	the treatment, diagnosis, testing, assessment, or counseling in a
11	professional relationship to assist individuals or groups to alleviate
12	behavioral and mental health disorders; understand unconscious or
13	conscious motivation; resolve emotional, relationship, or attitudinal
14	conflicts; or modify behaviors that interfere with effective emotional,
15	social, or intellectual functioning. Psychotherapy follows a planned
16	procedure of intervention that takes place on a regular basis, over a period
17	of time, or in the cases of testing, assessment, and brief psychotherapy,
18	psychotherapy can be a single intervention.
19	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 12-43-202.5 as
20	follows:
21	12-43-202.5. Minors - consent for outpatient psychotherapy -
22	legislative declaration - immunity. (1) (a) The General assembly
23	FINDS AND DECLARES THAT:
24	(I) THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL FOUND SUICIDE TO BE THE
25	TENTH LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH FOR ALL AGES IN $2013$ AND IS
26	CURRENTLY THE LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH FOR $\overline{ ext{C}}$ OLORADO YOUTH WHO
27	ARE TEN THROUGH FOURTEEN YEARS OF AGE;

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1	(II) ACCORDING TO THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF
2	SUICIDOLOGY, THE SUICIDE RATE FOR YOUTH WHO ARE TEN THROUGH
3	FOURTEEN YEARS OF AGE HAS INCREASED BY MORE THAN FIFTY PERCENT
4	OVER THE PAST THREE DECADES; AND
5	(III) YOUTH WHO ARE TEN THROUGH FOURTEEN YEARS OF AGE
6	OFTEN AVOID OBTAINING, OR ARE LEGALLY UNABLE TO OBTAIN WITHOUT
7	PARENTAL CONSENT, OUTPATIENT PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES THAT
8	WOULD HELP THEM PRIOR TO REACHING CRISIS LEVELS BECAUSE THEY ARE
9	EMBARRASSED OR CONCERNED ABOUT SPEAKING WITH THEIR PARENTS
10	ABOUT THEIR MENTAL HEALTH CONCERNS AND SITUATION.
11	(b) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THEREFORE DECLARES THAT IT IS A
12	MATTER OF STATEWIDE CONCERN TO ALLOW YOUTH WHO ARE TWELVE
13	YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER TO HAVE LEGAL ACCESS TO OUTPATIENT
14	PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES THAT MIGHT OTHERWISE BE UNAVAILABLE
15	WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF OR NOTIFICATION TO THE YOUTH'S PARENT OR
16	LEGAL GUARDIAN. PROVIDING THESE YOUTH WITH ACCESS TO OUTPATIENT
17	PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES IS INTENDED TO REDUCE YOUTH SUICIDES AND
18	ALLOW MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDERS TO WORK WITH YOUTH TO TEACH
19	THEM FUNCTIONAL COPING SKILLS. MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDERS WOULD
20	FURTHER HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO HELP THESE YOUTH BUILD HEALTHY
21	CONNECTIONS WITH PARENTS OR LEGAL GUARDIANS BY INCREASING
22	COMMUNICATION AND STRENGTHENING THE BOND BETWEEN PARENT AND
23	CHILD, THUS BUILDING AN ONGOING, NONCLINICAL SUPPORT SYSTEM FOR
24	THE YOUTH TO USE TO MANAGE HIS OR HER MENTAL HEALTH CONCERNS.
25	(2) (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
26	CONTRARY, A MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL WHO IS LICENSED
27	PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE 43 MAY, AT A MINOR'S REQUEST, PROVIDE

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1	PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES, AS THAT TERM IS DEFINED IN SECTION
2	12-43-201 (9)(a), TO A MINOR WHO IS AT LEAST TWELVE YEARS OF AGE,
3	BUT LESS THAN FIFTEEN YEARS OF AGE WITH OR WITHOUT THE CONSENT
4	OF THE MINOR'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN. THE MINOR'S CONSENT IS
5	NOT SUBJECT TO DISAFFIRMANCE BECAUSE OF MINORITY.
6	(b) A MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL WHO IS LICENSED PURSUANT
7	TO THIS ARTICLE 43 MAY NOT PROVIDE PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES TO A
8	MINOR WHO IS YOUNGER THAN TWELVE YEARS OF AGE WITHOUT THE
9	CONSENT OF THE MINOR'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN. A MENTAL
10	HEALTH PROFESSIONAL WHO IS LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE $\overline{43}$
11	MAY PROVIDE PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES TO A MINOR WHO IS FIFTEEN
12	YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER PURSUANT TO SECTION 27-65-103 (2).
13	(c) THE LICENSED MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL PROVIDING
14	PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES TO A MINOR PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION
15	(2) IS NOT REQUIRED TO, BUT MAY, WITH THE CONSENT OF THE MINOR,
16	ADVISE THE MINOR'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN OF THE
17	PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES PROVIDED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION $(2)(a)$ OF
18	THIS SECTION. A LICENSED MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL PROVIDING
19	SUCH PSYCHOTHERAPY SERVICES IS ENCOURAGED TO OBTAIN THE
20	CONSENT OF THE MINOR TO SPEAK TO THE MINOR'S PARENT OR LEGAL

25	SERIOUS BODILY HARM ON HIMSELF OR HERSELF OR OTHERS, THE MENTAL
26	HEALTH PROFESSIONAL IS SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION
27	13-21-117 (2).

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1	<b>SECTION 5.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, 27-60-103, add (8)
2	as follows:
3	27-60-103. Behavioral health crisis response system - services
4	- request for proposals - criteria - reporting - rules. (8) The State
5	DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES SHALL COORDINATE EFFORTS WITH THE
6	DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT TO IMPLEMENT A
7	STATEWIDE AWARENESS CAMPAIGN ABOUT YOUTH SUICIDE PREVENTION,
8	AS WELL AS AWARENESS OF THE TWENTY-FOUR-HOUR TELEPHONE CRISIS
9	SERVICE CREATED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. THE STATE DEPARTMENT
10	OF HUMAN SERVICES SHALL EXPAND YOUTH-SPECIFIC INTERVENTIONS,
11	INCLUDING TEXT-BASED SERVICES, WITHIN THE TWENTY-FOUR-HOUR
12	TELEPHONE CRISIS SERVICE TO SPECIFICALLY ADDRESS YOUTH SUICIDE

14	SECTION 6. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
15	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
16	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
